## Help us save our pool!



A big 'thank you' to all members of the CCHS community, and beyond, who supported our Swimathon last week. All in aid of supporting the modernisation project to 'save our pool', we are most grateful for all the contributions, and to the PE Department for organising this event. There will be more activities and events next academic year as we continue this vital work. The CCHS swimming pool is not just for our school; it is used by hundreds of children from local primary schools and clubs. It truly is a community pool.

I note below the messages the PE Department were sending as last week's Swimathon was taking place – what a tremendous effort the students and staff made, and what a wonderful achievement by them all:

11:17am - So far, our Year 12 students have swum an amazing 11,049m. What a great start to the day! Will the Year 8 beat them. Here's hoping.

12:03pm - Year 8 have done amazingly well. Five teams swam a total of 1,424 lengths = 28,195m. Overall total with Year 12 score is 39,244m. We are over halfway up the Chelmer river.

1:38pm - Year 9, just did amazingly. Brilliant fancy dress! They swam a total of 24,374m bringing the total so far to 63.618km. Just short of the 64km length of the river Chelmer. Let's see what the staff can do.

1:49pm - The staff who took part at lunch today, were fantastic and racked up 365 lengths 7,227m and taking us over the length of the Chelmer river! With still two years groups to go, how much further can we get? Overall total 70,845m. Absolutely fantastic!

4:03pm - Year 7 did an amazing job especially with their fancy dress. Ballerinas, Super Scuba Divers and The Magnificent 7 swam a total of 628 lengths - 12,434m. Total overall so far is 83,279m.

4:34pm - So, the final group, Year 10, finished in great form. With fantastic fancy dress, they completed 393 lengths = 7,781m. Total distance for today is 91,060m with a couple of students having to swim next week, we might get to 92km! Well done to everyone involved helping us to reach such an amazing total! Thank you to everyone that has donated, it has really helped to increase our total. Once we have a proper total, we will share it but it's looking like at least £3000!

#### **Chelmsford Science and Engineering Society TEXPO Competition**































#### STEM Leadership report

Earlier this year, applications opened to all year 9 students with the opportunity to be one of twenty selected to take part in the Level 1 STEM Leadership programme, that was led and organised by Dr Cannon and Mrs Kurian. After work from both the leading staff and participating students for most of the academic year, completing and marking tasks and organising and running activities for one another and younger students, the programme has drawn to a close. The work done by participating students is currently being externally approved to determine if we earn our Level 1 qualification. I, among my 19 other peers who participated in this programme, are extremely grateful for this opportunity to develop vital skills such as organisation, time management, teamwork, problem-solving and communication which can be used not only in a STEM setting but in day-to-day life and later in our education. Below are some reflections of our favourite moments while working towards this qualification throughout this year:

"Overall, this programme has been a great opportunity helping me to develop many skills but the one I think I've developed the most is my self-confidence. By no means was I timid before this opportunity but it has still managed to push me out of my comfort zone and encouraged me to talk to people I probably wouldn't have talked to as much, had I not taken part in this programme. It has just been such a lovely and safe environment to be in to encourage and share our love for all things involving STEM with not only one another but younger years as well, while being able to act as role models for them." "This programme helped me with two major skills which are my confidence as well as my time management. When we had to run our first activity to our peers, I was nervous as this was not something I would usually do. But during the activity, I really enjoyed it and then I started looking forward to the other activities that we had to run for the younger years. In the first activity we struggled a bit as we had left everything to the last-minute resulting in us realising we had major gaps the day before but for the second activity we made sure we did everything early so the day before all we had to was just look over it. "Participating in the STEM Leaders programme has really helped me improve my organisation and self-management skills. This has been an amazing experience and I've gained many new skills such as confidence which I've projected into my other school endeavors such as Geography presentations and Drama assessments. 






# ARTIST OF THE WEEK

Last week the Year 12 French students enjoyed a weeklong trip to Nice to develop and enhance their French language skills. We stayed in host families for the duration of the trip and spent the mornings taking French lessons at the International House Nice which were extremely valuable in improving our speaking abilities. During these lessons we learnt about a variety of new topics, from French gastronomy to the wide range of festivals in France, and learnt a whole variety of new

On the first day of the trip, we took a guided tour of Nice Old town and visited the French Riviera and 'La cascade de chateau' all whilst learning more about the history of Nice. # Keep on suing!

#### Context

The CCHS swimming pool was built in the 1960s, partly from funds raised by CCHS families. Dedicated upgrading and maintenance work over the years has ensured that the pool has served generations of students and young people across the Chelmsford community.

At the moment, our pool supports the PE curriculum for our 1,162 students, as well as nearly 200 pupils from five local primary schools, and nearly 600 young people from the wider community who use our pool with clubs.

Our swimming pool is truly a community pool.

#### Goal

Now is the time to modernise this important community resource to preserve it for future generations of students, pupils and young people. We are asking for your support now, just as the CCHS community rallied in the 1960s to ensure a pool was built, to help us achieve this important goal.

### **Fundraising**

We estimate that the pool will require up to £250,000 over the next two years to bring it back to a suitable condition to support swimming in our community for the foreseeable future.

Our immediate need is to replace our aged boiler and gas pipework, which will cost approximately £35,000.
