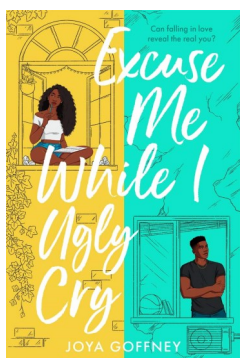

Research has shown that reading for pleasure has many benefits:

- ⇒ Regularly reading stories or novels outside of school is associated with higher scores in reading assessments
- ⇒ Evidence suggests that reading for pleasure is an activity that has emotional and social advantages
- ⇒ Other benefits to reading for pleasure include: text comprehension and grammar, positive reading attitudes, pleasure in reading in later life, increased general knowledge

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## INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP DAY

30th July is the International Day of Friendship. It was started in 2011 by the UN General Assembly with the idea that friendship between peoples, countries, cultures and individuals can inspire peace efforts and build bridges between communities.

The resolution places emphasis on involving young people, as future leaders, in community activities that include different cultures and promote international understanding and respect for diversity.

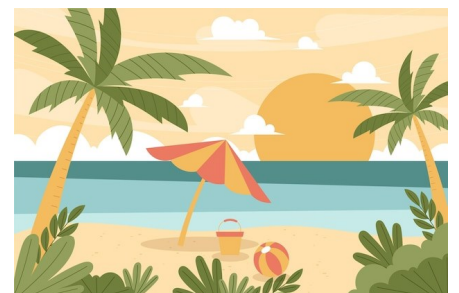

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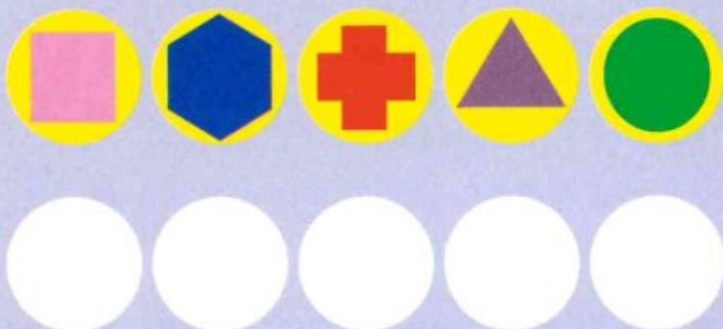

## LOGIC SEQUENCE

The lower row of shapes, which is hidden, is in a different sequence than the top row. The hidden row does, however, conform to the following rules:

- Neither the cross nor the circle is next to the hexagon.
- Neither the cross nor the circle is next to the triangle.
- Neither the circle nor the hexagon is next to the square.
- The triangle is just to the right of the square.

Can you work out the hidden sequence?
